

Caring For Your Wound After It Is Treated With Dermabond Topical Skin Adhesive

Dermabond is a sterile, liquid skin adhesive used to maintain skin approximation after surgery. The liquid will harden immediately upon application and usually remains intact for 5 to 10 days after your procedure. The Dermabond will naturally slough off your skin after approximately 5 to 10 days.

How to care for your surgical site:

- · Keep the wound dry and bandage in place for 24 hours after your surgery.
- · After 24 hours, you may shower and gently cleanse the area <u>surrounding</u> the Dermabond. DO NOT scrub directly over the surgical site where the Dermabond has been applied; rather, allow the soap and water to run across the wound.
- · After showering, gently blot the wound with a soft towel to dry.
- · You do not need to replace the bandage over the wound area. The Dermabond will serve as a protective barrier.
- · DO NOT clean the area multiple times per day. This may loosen Dermabond from your skin.

Keep the wound dry and protected:

- · DO NOT apply any topical products (e.g. ointments, lotions, or topical medications) to the area until the Dermabond has naturally fallen off.
- \cdot DO NOT soak, swim, or scrub the wound until all of the Dermabond has natural fallen off. \cdot AVOID periods of heavy perspiration or physical activity that may open your wound until the Dermabond has naturally fallen off.
- Protect your skin from potential injury for the next two weeks. Apply a dry, clean bandage over the Dermabond if you feel the need to protect it. DO NOT apply adhesive tape directly over the Dermabond.
- DO NOT scratch, rub, or pick at the area or the Dermabond. Doing so may rip off the adhesive and cause your wound to open.
- · Avoid direct sunlight as this may darken your scar. If you are outside, protect the wound with a clean, dry bandage.
